

## INSTALLATION OF AN END PIN JACK

Installing an end pin jack into a guitar that already has a tapered wooden end pin requires special attention. By following the steps outlined below, you can produce a very clean hole with very little risk of damaging the guitar. If you do not feel comfortable with this procedure, it would be wise to consult your local repair person.

- 1. Do not remove the wooden end pin. Instead, saw it off with a fine tooth X-acto saw. Do not try to cut flush with the body or you may damage the finish. Cut about 1/16-inch away from the body. Apply masking tape around the area to protect the finish before you start.
- 2. Use a scribe to center punch the end pin plug exactly on center. This will provide a guide for drilling the pilot hole.



- 3. Drill a pilot hole with a 1/8" drill straight with the center line of the top and square with the sides.
- 4. Place a spade bit in the pilot hole (we use a 1/2-inch bit with the edges ground down to 15/32-inch). Drill the hole, keeping square to the body at all times. Ease up on the feed pressure a little as the drill breaks through the other side. A 1/2-inch Forstner bit from you local hardware store may also be used with good results.

## **IMPORTANT! PUSH THE DRILL ALL THE WAY** THROUGH AND LET IT COME TO A COMPLETE STOP BEFORE **RETRACTING IT OUT OF THE**

5. Remove debris from the hole and the inside of the guitar. Install the end pin jack.
